Dear guests colleagues and students,

It is a pleasure to welcome you, on behalf of Babeş-Bolyai University, to the 3rd edition of the annual international conference of the Faculty of European Studies, which has made a name for itself amongst experienced scholars and young researchers alike, under the historically noteworthy title of 'Disintegration and Integration in East-Central Europe'. Depuis quelques temps déjà, l'habitude a été prise entre la Faculté des études européennes de l'Université Babes-Bolyai de Cluj et les historiens de l'IEP de Strasbourg d'une coopération sur les questions européennes. Cela s'est non seulement traduit par des thèses en co-tutelle, mais également par des manifestations scientifiques qui ont bénéficié du concours du partenaire. Le colloque de Berlin se situe dans cette ligne.

Esquissé au lendemain du colloque de Cluj de 2014, le programme berlinois tente d'explorer la voie de la réconciliation en Europe centrale et orientale. Pour ce faire, il entend l'apprécier au regard d'une autre réconciliation : celle de la France et de l'Allemagne. Cela rend la poursuite de cette coopération Cluj-Strasbourg encore plus pertinente. Si on reconnaît à Strasbourg une valeur symbolique en matière de rapprochement franco-allemand, insistant sur la pluralité culturelle issue de son histoire, on ne peut pas ne pas voir également la même pluralité culturelle à l'oeuvre à Cluj. La fin de la division de l'Europe ouvre un nouveau chapitre de son histoire, à la fois à l'est et à l'ouest. Dès lors comment dépasser dans la partie orientale de l'Europe les frontières, les identités ? Peut-on s'y servir de l'expérience occidentale ? Mais même à l'ouest, et notamment cette réconciliation présentée comme exemplaire entre la France et l'Allemagne mérite toujours une approche critique et une attention constante. Est-ce de la rhétorique pure au regard d'objectifs souvent contradictoires ? La certitude d'une mission historique commune ? Le rapprochement engage-t-il au-delà du couple Paris-Berlin ? Auprès de qui : des partenaires européens ou même au-delà ?

Ces questions seront abordées au cours de ces journées de Berlin. Celles-ci constituent la troisième édition du cycle Désintégration et intégration en Europe centrale et orientale initié par la Faculté d'études européennes de l'université Babes-Bolyai. La dimension comparative de cette problématique européenne permet aux collègues de Cluj et à ceux de Strasbourg de poursuivre et d'approfondir leurs échanges.

Sylvain Schirmann is a historian and a PhD Professor at the University of Strasbourg, holder of a Jean Monnet Chair dedicated to the history of European construction. He was the Director of the Institute for Political Science at the University of Strasbourg between 2006 and 2015. His research chiefly focuses on the history of Franco-German relations in the contemporary era, the history of economic and financial international relations, as well as of social movements in international affairs. He has had an important contribution to the academic events, doctoral school and international projects of the Faculty of European Studies, where he teaches courses every year. He is a member of the European Union Liaison Committee of Historians, a reputable author of books and articles and a contributor to numerous international research projects.






