## Call for Papers

- *Politique Européenne*, Publisher : L'Harmattan, is a bilingual (French/English) journal, which publishes original articles in thematic or varia issues covering the entire field of European Studies (policy analysis, international relations, political sociology, political theory or political anthropology...). Each issue also includes a on-going research articles, as well as book reviews and review essays. *Politique Européenne* is published thanks to the financial support of the Institut des sciences humaines et sociales of the CNRS (CNRS-INSHS), the Pacte Grenoble laboratory (CNRS, University of Grenoble), the Centre d'études européenne (Sciences Po) and ESPOL (Université catholique de Lille). It publishes special thematic issues, varia issues, along with research-in-progress articles, book reviews and review articles. - *The quarterly journal, Relations internationales* is published by the Institut d'Histoire des Relations Internationales Contemporaines, the Graduate Institute of International and Development Studies in Geneva, and the Institut Pierre Renouvin (Université Paris 1 Panthéon-Sorbonne). *Relations internationales* publishes four issues a year, each dedicated to a specific theme of contemporary international history, from the late nineteenth century to recent history, or new research. The editors are experienced history professors, postgraduates, and researchers. International figures also contribute perspective and experience. The journal presents actual case studies based on a wide range of sources, and in particular, archives (when researchers are permitted access), but also theoretical articles and critical reviews of important scientific works. It has four issues per year. One is devoted to "New research", i.e. a selection of varied articles, often works by young authors, but not exclusively, another is essentially made up of a thematic dossier on a subject chosen by the editorial board, and two issues publish the contributions presented at the annual colloquium jointly organized by the IHRIC and the IHEID. These publications are in paper and electronic form. The articles will be sent to the editor-in-chief of the journal, Mrs. Catherine Nicault, in the form of an attached file. Articles will not exceed 40-45,000 characters (notes included). They must include a few intertitles and be followed by a summary in French (800 characters or 120 words), its translation into English as well as that of the title of the article. The notes, placed at the bottom of the page, will be numbered automatically and continuously from one end of the article to the other. Wednesday 20 Jul 2022 @ 10.00 - 11.30 | Webinar Zoom.* The new research area at the Robert Schuman Centre 'Southeastern Europe: Transitions, Prospects, Crossroads' is launching an online training for applicants in the humanities and social science from Southeastern Europe who intend to participate in the Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions (MSCA) in September 2022. In particular, the training is addressed to researchers in the areas history, political science, sociology, legal studies, and economics. This pilot initiative is a part of the research areas interest in building capacities of researchers from the region to be competitive in international funding bids, and a broader objective of internationalizing early career scholars from Southeastern Europe. The training will consist of two 90-minute sessions: one dedicated to the scientific parts of the application and researcher profile; and one devoted to the formal aspects of the process and evaluation criteria. The training is complementary to the work of the National Contact Points (NCPs) for the MSCA, who are able to provide detailed information on the different MSCA actions and the application process for each of them. - *Transforming State Socialism in East-Central Europe. Historical Sociology of the Long Change international conference, 30 September- 1 October 2022, University of Warsaw.* This international conference aims to promote and strengthen sociohistorical research on the transformations of state socialism in East-Central Europe (ECE). It will advance the knowledge on the sociogenesis of contemporary societies in East-Central Europe by focusing on the continuities and change. It should also contribute to our understanding of the dynamics of integration with the capitalist world system and how ECE countries place within the structures of global dependencies. Following this aim, we seek to pursue several questions: what was state socialism in comparison with capitalism? Where did the impulses for changing the socialist system come from? How new research on state socialism change our perception of the regime change of 1989? How to integrate the socialist experience into the framework of global history? We particularly encourage empirical research focusing on long-term processes. We also welcome new theoretical conceptualizations of the evolutions of state socialism and the capitalist transformations. *Proposals for the conference should be submitted electronically to [transformingsocialism@uw.edu.pl](mailto:transformingsocialism@uw.edu.pl) by July 15.* Proposals must include, in a single Pdf file: the paper's abstract (250-300 words, excluding title) that also specifies (i) your name, (ii) academic affiliation and your academic CV (maximum 1 page). All conference submissions must be in English, and all accepted works are to be presented in English. Participation in this conference is free of charge. Conference organizers can provide travel grants up to ?100 per person, for the participation of Early Stage Researchers from outside Warsaw, whose papers have been accepted for presentation. ## Calls for projects/Fellowships

- **UACES Scholarships.** Since 2002, UACES has awarded hundreds of travel scholarships to postgraduate students from many different countries. The scholarships are travel bursaries designed to provide mobility to existing postgraduate students so that they can undertake research in another country. The scholarships are NOT for students looking for funding to enroll in a postgraduate course. You need to be a PhD Researcher Member of UACES (based in any country) in order to apply for a UACES scholarship. **Deadline 14 Oct 2022.** For 2023, there are 4 UACES scholarships available for a fixed amount of 1,500 GBP to be awarded on a competitive basis to UACES members. These scholarships are open to postgraduate students worldwide undertaking research in any area of contemporary European Studies. - **IEG Fellowship Programme.** The Leibniz Institute of European History (IEG) awards fellowships to young academics (doctoral and postdoctoral researchers) from Germany and abroad. Funding is provided for both doctoral and postdoctoral research dealing with the religious, political, social and cultural history of Europe from the early modern period to 1989/90. Comparative, transnational and transfer-historical research projects are particularly welcome, as are projects which deal with topics of intellectual, theological or church history. If they wish, fellowship holders and fellows can collaborate with the academic staff of the IEG in the Institute's research areas. Each fellowship holder is assigned a contact person from among the academic staff of the IEG who can offer them advice and mentoring. Research projects must be at least six months in duration in order to avail of IEG funding. Fellowship holders and fellows reside and work in the Institute building in Mainz. The specialist library of the Institute and the other infrastructure that Mainz has to offer as an academic center are available to the fellowship holders and fellows to conduct their research. The duty to reside at the Institute does not preclude short trips to archives, libraries, specialist researchers and conferences elsewhere. The working languages at the IEG are German and English and therefore we expect proficiency in English and a sufficient command of German to participate in discussions at the Institute. - **European policy experimentation in higher education (ERASMUS-EDU-2022-POL-EXP-HE).** The general objective of this call for proposals is to test and explore deeper transnational cooperation instruments to further develop a genuinely European dimension in the higher education sector, built on shared values, as mentioned in the European strategy for universities presented by the Commission on 18 January 2022 and as confirmed in the Council Conclusions on a European strategy empowering higher education institutions for the future of Europe and the Council recommendation on building bridges for effective European higher education cooperation, adopted on 5 April 2022. The specific objective of this topic is to examine, test and facilitate the use of existing institutionalized cooperation instruments at European level, such as a possible legal status for alliances of higher education institutions - for example 'European Universities', with the objective of facilitating deeper, long-term and flexible transnational cooperation. The aim is to give alliances, on a voluntary basis, the latitude to act together, make common strategic decisions, experiment joint recruitment, design joint curricula or pool resources and human, technical, data, education, research and innovation capacities. This includes:
  - **Topic 1: Pilot a joint European degree label.** Exploring at the level of the alliance how an existing institutionalized cooperation EU instrument, such as a possible legal status for alliances of higher education institutions at European level can provide solutions to the obstacles encountered with regard to the deeper cooperation that the alliances are pursuing. The objective is to test the implementation of existing EU instruments - such as the European grouping of territorial cooperation (EGTC) or the European Economic Interest Grouping (EEIG) - based on a needs assessment of the alliance and taking into account where relevant the regulatory regional/national frameworks to which the individual higher education institutions part of the alliance need to adhere to;
  - **Topic 2: Pilot institutionalized.** EU cooperation instruments to explore the feasibility for a possible European legal status for alliances of higher education institutions Where appropriate, elaborating a proposal for improvement of the existing institutionalized cooperation EU instruments or key elements for the design of a new EU level instrument.
- The available call budget is **EUR 1,000,000**. The grant parameters (maximum grant amount, funding rate, total eligible costs, etc.) will be fixed in the Grant Agreement. Project budget (**maximum grant amount**): **EUR 200,000 per project**. Call opening: 15 June 2022. **Deadline for submission: 6 October 2022 - 17:00:00 CET (Brussels)**, Evaluation: October 2022 - January 2023, Information on evaluation results: Mid - January 2023 GA signature: February - March 2023.
