• Journal on Ethnopolitics and Minority Issues in Europe, Vol. 22, No. 2. Deadline 15 July 2023. The Journal on Ethnopolitics and Minority Issues in Europe) (JEMIE), the flagship journal of the European Centre for Minority Issues (ECMI), invites research articles, commentaries, and book reviews from practitioners, academics, and students on all aspects of ethnopolitics and minority issues. JEMIE is a peer-reviewed electronic open-access journal that particularly seeks to publish critical analyses of developments and policies in European institutions and their member states, their relations with the European neighborhood broadly understood, and other immediate neighbors. The journal also welcomes contributions on non-European perspectives on minority issues and minority issues in Europe in a global context. The submission process runs via the Open Journal Systems (OJS) software. Regarding indexing and abstracting, JEMIE is now listed under Scopus. It is also listed in the Directory of Open Access Journals (DOAJ), the European Reference Index for the Humanities and Social Sciences (ERIH+), as well as several others. Research articles should be between 5,000 and 10,000 words. Commentaries reflecting on contemporary events should be no longer than 5,000 words. Book reviews of up to 1,000 words are very welcome. - JCMS Special Issue. Deadline 15 June 2023. Applications are invited for the guest editorship of a special issue of Journal of Common Market Studies (JCMS), which will be completed in mid-2024 and published in early 2025 under the general supervision of the JCMS editors. Proposals should be for 8-14 articles (editorial overview and original articles) of up to 8,500 words in length (inclusive of references, tables, figures and bibliographies). Proposals should be concise: no longer than 1000 words. Please include full abstracts and abbreviated CVs of prospective authors. Proposals need to indicate how far advanced the project is and whether any papers exist in draft versions. The deadline for the submission of proposals to the JCMS Editorial Team (JCMS@uaces.org) is on June 15, 2023. JCMS editors will then consider proposals. The Editorial Office will inform the successful team by the beginning of August 2023. - Policy Studies: Special Issue: The first consequences of the war in Ukraine. Deadline August 1 2023. This special issue will consider the first consequences of the war, still ongoing at the time of the call, aware that these are changing in real time. Papers are welcome on the effects of the war on particular policy areas in Ukraine, across Europe and globally- but also how theoretical concepts such as 'exogenous shocks' and 'punctuated equilibrium' are used for understanding policy change. Papers should typically be 5,000 to 7,000 words in length, but longer articles of up to 10,000 words are also welcome. Submissions should follow the Policy Studies instructions for authors. Authors are asked to contact the Editor-in-Chief, Toby James, in advance to inform him of the intention to submit. Submissions should be made before 1st August 2023. Please note, however, that papers will be reviewed and published on a rolling basis so early submission is strongly advised. - Conference on 'EU Enlargement, Geopolitics, and the Russian-Ukraine War, Belgrade, Serbia, 21-22 October 2023. Deadline July 15, 2023. We are pleased to invite applications to attend the conference on EU Enlargement Policy, Geopolitics, and the Russian-Ukraine War, which will take place on October 21-22, 2023 at the Belgrade Faculty of Political Science. ## **Calls for Projects/Fellowships**

- French Institutes for Advanced Study (FIAS) Fellowship Programme 2024/2025. Deadline June 6 2023. The French Institutes for Advanced Study Fellowship Programme offers 10-month fellowships in the seven Institutes of Aix-Marseille, Loire Valley (Orléans-Tours), Lyon, Montpellier, Nantes, Paris and Rennes. It welcomes applications from high-level international scholars and scientists to develop their innovative research project in France. For the 2024-2025 academic year, FIAS offers 40 fellowship positions: 4 in Aix-Marseille, 3 in Loire Valley (Orléans-Tours), 10 in Lyon, 3 in Montpellier, 4 in Nantes, 13 in Paris and 3 in Rennes. The call is open to all disciplines in the social sciences and the humanities (SSH) and all research fields. Research projects in other sciences and in arts that propose a strong interaction and dialogue with the SSH are also eligible. Some host IAS have scientific priorities that need to be taken into full consideration before applying. The FIAS fellows will be free to organize their research while benefiting from the support and conducive scientific environment offered by the IAS characterised by a multidisciplinary cohort of fellows and by close relation to the local research centres and laboratories. All IAS have agreed on common standards, including the provision of a living allowance (2,700€ per month), social security coverage, accommodation, a research and training budget, plus coverage of travel expenses. FIAS awards fellowships to outstanding researchers of all career levels, from postdoctoral researchers to senior scientists. The minimum requirement is a PhD + 2 years of research experience at the time of the application. Exceptions will be made for scholars with a Master + 6 years of full-time research experience after the degree (PhD training will not be considered in the calculation of experience). Researchers from all countries are eligible to the FIAS Fellowship Programme but they must have spent no more than 12 months in France during the three years prior to the application deadline. Applications are submitted online via www.fias-fp.eu where you will find detailed information regarding the content of the application, eligibility criteria and selection procedure. Application deadline: June 6, 2023 - 6:00 pm (France time).
