

Accommodation Applications for PhD Students– Academic Year 2026–2027

Applications for accommodation in the dormitories of Babeş-Bolyai University for the 2026–2027 academic year must be submitted **by email** to the secretary of the Doctoral School of International Relations and European Studies at **rodica.rusu@ubbcluj.ro**, during the following period:

- **7-9* September**

** For PhD students admitted during the September 2026 admission session, accommodation applications must be submitted during the place confirmation period, **September 15–16, 2026**, by 2:00 PM.*

Required documents

To apply for accommodation, please submit the following documents:

1. Accommodation application form
2. Copy of your identity card or passport
3. Certificate issued by the Institute of Doctoral Studies confirming your enrolment as a PhD student for the current academic year (**not required for first-year PhD students**);
4. Europass CV
5. Scientific activity report (with supporting documents – e.g., certificates of conference participation, conference abstracts, published scientific papers, membership in research teams, research projects, grants, etc.). *Applicants are kindly requested to calculate their score in accordance with the provisions of the accommodation regulations..*

Incomplete application will be rejected!

Dormitory places will be granted to the following categories of students:

- Tuition-free (state-funded) students enrolled in full-time programs, who do not have a permanent residence within 20 km of Cluj-Napoca;
- Married students, provided both spouses are students;
- Students orphaned of one or both parents and those coming from orphanages or foster care;
- Students with severe or major disabilities;

- Students who do not have a permanent residence within 20 km of Cluj-Napoca, within the limits of available places.

The order in which places are allocated is initially determined by the type of study program the PhD students are enrolled in, as follows:

- Priority is given to state-funded, full-time PhD students, followed by
- tuition-paying, full-time students, and then
- tuition-paying, part-time students.
